SUBJECT: PC 17-056 Update on the 2016 Annual Progress Report on the Monterey County 2010 General Plan Implementation & 2016 Annual Housing Progress Report

Dear Chair Padilla and Members of the Commission:

When the General Plan was adopted almost 7 years ago, it was recognized that decisions on many difficult issues were delayed, and that the "can was being kicked down the road" for later action. Well, the proverbial can is still rolling. Of the over 200 policies identified by LandWatch, only 11% have been implemented, and this number does not include nine mitigation measures included in the FEIR needed to address impacts of the 2010 General Plan. While 52% of the policies are under development and have been for several years, 37% have no schedule for adoption. Fourteen of the policies have passed General Plan due dates.

In addition, several of these policies are subject to litigation, and one recently filed lawsuit seeks a writ of mandamus for the County's failure to implement two important policies related to affordable housing, including the long-overdue requirement that the County adopt a Development Evaluation System (DES). If the County doesn't address the DES immediately, it will be exposed to further costly litigation.

As in previous testimony, LandWatch has urged the County to provide adequate resources to the Planning Department and County Counsel's Office to finally complete the General Plan, and that this be done before the next General Plan update is required! Further, the County should make implementing the Development Evaluation System (DES) a top priority to avoid more litigation exposure.

At the Board of Supervisor's hearing on General Plan implementation, County Planning staff identified following tasks in order of priority:

- 1. SVGWB Study
- 2. Ag Land Mitigation
- 3. Tracking System
- 4. Hazard Mitigation Plan
- 5. Local Agency Management Program (LAMP)
- 6. Water and Energy Efficient Landscape Ordinance
- 7. DES

When asked about moving DES forward, staff responded that other tasks were higher priority because of funding and grants. LandWatch's understanding is that Monterey County Water Resources Agency is the lead on item #1 and Environmental Health is the lead on #5. According to the staff report item #4 is complete. What that means is that the Planning Department is responsible for items #2, 3, 6, and 7.

DES should be given a significantly higher priority, especially because of the legal liability (and costs) it poses to the County and because most of the work on the DES system is done and ready for public hearings. LandWatch stands ready to help the County complete its DES system within 30 days.
